The undersigned, being all of the directors of the Hoback Ranches Improvement And Service District (District) hereby unanimously adopt the following resolution at the annual meeting of the board of directors of the District on July 20___, 2013.

WHEREAS when the District was formed in 1986 the Petition for formation contained a statement that the there would be a maximum of eight mills that could be levied against a property in any given year; and

WHEREAS the Board Of County Commissioners authorized the formation of the District and there is the perception that an eight cap mill levy is in effect with respect to the District; and

WHEREAS Wyoming Statutes §§ 18-12-101 et. seq. pertaining to Improvement And Service Districts no longer provide for an actual mill levy; but rather, provide for the levying of annual assessments in accordance with benefits as determined by the District's Board of Directors (§ 18-12-115); and

WHEREAS the Improvement And Service Districts statutes no longer impose a cap on the maximum amount of assessments that may be levied by the Board provided the Board advertises its notice of the annual budget meeting, formally adopts a budget, and timely submits the same to the County Assessor;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board is not restricted to an eight mill levy and may impose assessments to be equitably apportioned amongst the owners within the District in accordance with the benefits, following the adoption of a budget in accordance with Wyoming law.
